

HUMANITIES & SOCIAL SCIENCES RESEARCH GRANT PROGRAM**Department Nomination Deadline: April 1, 2009****Guidelines and Information**

This program is designed to assist talented graduate students in education, social sciences, fine arts, and humanities to pursue original research. Since these disciplines traditionally have limited access to extramural funds, this program's purpose is to help redress an imbalance in funding for graduate student research. Doctoral domestic and international students may apply.

Eligibility

Applicants must be advanced to doctoral candidacy and must be enrolled as a full-time graduate student at UCSB, or on official Leave of Absence, and in good academic standing, at the time of application. Award recipients must be registered during Spring Quarter of the current year. Students may receive this award once during their academic career at UCSB.

Doctoral P3 (2A) class level students are not eligible for central fellowship funds. (A student enrolled for more than 9 quarters since advancement to doctoral candidacy is P3 class level.) For example, if Spring 2009 is a student's tenth registered quarter since advancement to candidacy, that student is not eligible to apply for this fellowship.

Terms of the Award

Awards will be for a maximum of \$2,000. The committee may award a lesser amount than requested by the applicant. Award recipients must be registered during Spring Quarter of the current year, and awards will be disbursed by the end of June. Award recipients must complete the project and submit a final report to the sponsoring faculty no later than one year from the date of the award.

Award Determination

A multidisciplinary faculty review committee will make award recommendations. Awards will be based on academic merit, the feasibility/validity of the proposed project, the qualifications of the applicant in relation to the project, and the significance and originality of the project. Awardees will be notified by mail, in care of the campus academic departments, by June of the current year.

Application:

1. **Cover Sheet** (see attached)
2. **Curriculum Vitae** - a copy of the applicant's cv, not to exceed two pages
3. **Budget** (please use the budget template provided) - A one-page budget must be included that details and justifies the projected expenses. Note: Major items of non-expendable equipment (such as computers) may not be purchased with these funds. Funds may not be used for meals, student salary or for costs associated with attending study centers or for taking courses. Costs must be reasonable and necessary;
4. **Project Plan** - the proposed project should be described in a plan not to exceed 1,200 words, typed and double-spaced, standard-sized font. The proposal should be easily understood by a group of faculty from different fields, and discipline specific jargon should be avoided if possible and explained when necessary.

Proposal Format: The diversity of subjects and forms of creativity in these disciplines make it difficult to suggest a standard proposal format. Your proposal should succinctly state your objective and the significance of your research. To the degree feasible, it is suggested that all proposals follow this format:

- Objective(s) of study
- Background/content of investigation
- Research approach and procedures
- Schedule of research
- Your qualifications and preparation for this project
- Anticipated results and significance of results

5. **Letters of Recommendation** - two sealed letters are required to be sent from faculty members with at least one from the student's advisor.
