My primary research interests are women and work, education, educational policy, feminism, Chicana political consciousness and Latina/o immigrant communities. Specific topics such as labor market segmentation, race/gender discrimination in employment and education, school attrition, and the intersection of family/work and ethnicity are major themes in my field research.
